
## SECTION-II

## **FOREST ESTABLISHMENT**



## **FOREST ESTABLISHMENT**

Forests are managed by the personnel of the Indian Forest Service and State Forest Service with ground level support from the range officers and forest guards. Apart from them, a majority of the State Forest Departments (SFDs) have scientific staff, veterinary doctors and other support staff on their rolls. The forest sector of the country is administered broadly at two levels: at the federal level by the Ministry of Environment and Forests and at the state/UTs level by the Forest Departments. The Union Ministry of Environment and Forests is responsible mainly for framing national policies and laws, providing partial financial support, undertaking research and national survey, imparting training to senior officials and over all monitoring the sector whereas the major responsibility to protect, conserve, manage, administer and develop forests and wildlife lies with state governments/UTs for respective jurisdiction. The Principal Chief Conservator of Forests is the head of the forest forces of the states. In smaller Union Territories the forest force may be headed by a Chief Conservator of Forests, or a Conservator of Forests. The forest department in a state is administratively divided into territorial circles, each headed by a Conservator of Forests. These are further divided into Divisions, headed by a Deputy Conservator of Forests (DCF). The next level is ranges with a Ranger in charge and then beats with forest guards. There may be some functional circles and divisions as well which have been created for specific tasks, like the Working Plan Circle (Table 2.3).

For the purpose of administration each State Forest Department has, in general, two main wings, territorial forests and wildlife, each headed by a Principal Chief Conservator of Forests. Forest Divisions form the basic unit of forest administration and management. The divisions are divided into Ranges and each Range into sections/blocks and beats for undertaking all field operations and is headed by field functionaries/front line staff (Table 2.5). Overall field staff position is given in Table 2.4.

The wildlife wing is generally responsible for management and protection of National Parks, Wildlife Sanctuaries, Zoological Parks and other wildlife activities. In many cases officers heading territorial divisions have the responsibility to take care of wildlife protection and management in their territory. The jurisdiction of territorial and wildlife wings sometimes overlaps. The range and beat type structure in the National Parks and WL Sanctuary are often not clearly defined.

Few SFDs have in place research institutes as well who carry out research on problems specific to the state. These institutes employ scientists, research assistants, and other scientific staff. Training institutes for rangers, foresters and forest guards also exist where periodic and specialized training courses are held.

The Indian Forest Service Officers are annually recruited by the Central Government by holding a national competitive examination through Union Public Service Commission (UPSC) and are trained Indian Forest Service are trained in the Indira Gandhi National Forest Academy, Dehradun. The State Forest Service officers form the second line of command in the Forest Department and are recruited by the state

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governments. These officers are inducted into IFS in due course of time, which is minimum 8 years. The State Forest Service officers receive their training in the Central Academy for State Forest Service (CASFOS) at Dehradun, Coimbatore and Burnihat.

The Field Executive staff and other supporting staff are also recruited by the State /UT Governments according to their requirements. The recruitments in these positions are not regular. The induction training of the Forest Rangers is controlled by the Directorate of Forest Education (DFE) and done at Central Academy for State Forest Service, Burnihat and three Rangers Colleges run by State Governments at Ranger College, Balaghat, Madhya Pradesh; Uttarakhand Forest Academy, Haldwani, Uttarakhand and Andhra Pradesh Forest Academy, Dulapally, Hyderabad. The responsibility of imparting training to the lower field executive/ front line staff, that is, Deputy Rangers, Foresters and Forest Guards lies with the respective State/UT Governments. There are 65 State Forest Training Schools (SFTS) and Academies spread over in 26 States/UTs in India, which imparts induction training of six month to one year duration as well as short term refresher courses.

There are other training institutions under MoEF which offer specialized courses of long and short durations.

Data on revenue and expenditure of the forest departments of the states have been detailed in table 2.1. The figures have been taken from the annual reports/other reports of the state forest departments. Separate tables have been given for the territorial and functional set up of the departments (2.2 and 2.3). These tables comprise data on the number of circles, divisions, ranges, beats and other sub-divisions of the administrative set up of the forest departments of the states and union territories. Tables 2.4 and 2.5 detail the position of field staff on an all India basis and state-wise respectively.
