Patron's Column

The Indian Council of Forestry Research and Education (ICFRE), Dehradun, an autonomous Council under the Ministry of Environment,



Forests and Climate Change, New Delhi is mandated to carry out research, promote education and to extend outcomes of research to the various stakeholders ranging from farmers to State Forest Departments and artisans to industries.

The Council had been engaged in a big way for DPR Preparation of Forestry Interventions for Ganga under National Mission for Clean Ganga. The first consultation meeting for DPR preparation of forestry intervention for Ganga for the State of Uttarakhand was held on 16 and 17 April 2015 at FRI, Dehradun followed by Consultation meetings of Uttar Pradesh and Bihar. The first national level 'Kick-off meeting of the stakeholders of five states' for DPR preparation of forestry intervention for Ganga was held on 25 and 26 May 2015 at FRI, Dehradun.

The Council is known for development of innovative environment friendly technologies, processes and products. In the process, a new biopesticide "Crawl Clean" has been developed by IFGTB, Coimbatore for the control of papaya mealy bug. In an effort to extend the research outputs for the end users, IFGTB, Coimbatore has entered into a non-exclusive license agreement with the International Papers - APPM Limited to commercially propagate five high-yielding clones of Casuarina developed by the Institute. Similarly, IWST, Bengaluru has filed one provisional patent for "New Composition of Soap" for dissemination of the process to the industry.

The Council is providing consultancy services on various environmental issues in different sectors including hydropower and reclamation of mined areas. 'Environmental Audit of 20 opencast coal mines operated by Coal India Limited & subsidiary coal companies' has been awarded to ICFRE by Coal India Limited. FRI, Dehradun has entered into a consultancy agreement with Bharat Coking Coal Ltd. (BCCL) Dhanbad to act as technical advisor/expert for the ecological restoration work being undertaken by BCCL on Over Burden dumps/mined out areas.

In a first of its kind a two days Tree Growers Mela was organised by RFRI, Jorhat in North-East India during March 2015 for sensitizing various stakeholders about the technologies and processes available for dissemination. Similarly, networking activities were undertaken in collaboration with KVK by all institutes under the council for wider reach of research programmes of the council.

I earnestly hope that this issue of the Newsletter will be helpful in highlighting the diverse activities being undertaken in the Council.

Research Findings

- A new species of Aprostocetus parasitizing Pauropsylla ficicola a leaf gall making psyllid of Ficus roxburghii has been identified at FRI, Dehradun.
- FIFGTB, Coimbatore has made an attempt to reclaim the barren laterite lands in Kasargod District (Kerala) using beneficial microbes. Beneficial microbes such as AM fungi, Phosphobacterium and Azospirillum were cultured and were inoculated in the seedlings of Switenea macrophylla, Ailanthus tryphysa, Holoptelia integrifolia and Butea monosperma. Upon inoculation, these seedlings were grown in laterite soils as potting media. The improved seedlings were planted in barren laterite lands for studying their out planting performance. The seedlings shown good growth and survival performance in the field conditions though they were planted in summer months. New leaves and branches appeared in the planted seedlings with minimum water regime.
- FIFGTB, Coimbatore attempted to isolate Actinomycete isolates from soil samples collected from agro-forestry sites in Tamil Nadu. An experiment was conducted to

determine the antagonistic activity of 35 different isolates of Actinomycetes isolates against selected plant pathogenic fungi viz., Fusarium moniliformorme, Rhizoctoia solani and Sclerotium rolfsii under in vitro conditions. Among 35 Actinomycetes isolates, one isolate (Actinomycete No.2:10) showed strong antagonistic activity against the selected plant pathogens. The isolate was identified as Streptomyces samponii through molecular characterization (gene bank accession formula: Streptomyces KP970678).

** Achromobacter xyoloxidans — A potential plant growth promoter as well as bio-control agent:IFGTB, Coimbatore has found one bacterium isolate, Achromobacter xyoloxidans in tannery effluent treatment

- plant, Dindigul, Tamil Nadu which had very good plant growth promoting factor and was further screened for its bio-control activity against selected plant pathogens viz., Alternaria solani, Curvularia lunata and Fusarium oxysporum under in vitro condition. The bacterium isolate was found most effective against *C. lunata* (95%), followed by *A. solani* (85%) and *F. oxysporum* (80%).
- Based on the histo- anatomical and biochemical studies on culms of different stages of bamboo conducted at IWST, Bengaluru, starch content in flowered bamboo has been found less as compared to non-flowered bamboo and flowering did not affect the bending strength of bamboo. The findings suggest that flowered bamboo can be stored safely for longer period without much deterioration and can have applications similar to non-flowered bamboo.
- **IWST, Bengaluru has developed an efficient and new route for synthesis of carboxymethyl cellulose (CMC), a most widely used biopolymer for various applications.

Commercial propagation of five high-yielding clones of Casuarina

The International Papers - APPM Limited has entered into a non-exclusive license agreement with IFGTB to commercially propagate five high-yielding clones of Casuarina developed by IFGTB, Coimbatore. These clones viz. IFGTB-CJ-7, IFGTB-CJ-9, IFGTB-CJ-10, IFGTB-CH-1 and IFGTB-CH-2 have been extensively tested in contrasting locations like coastal, inland regions, irrigated and rainfed conditions and found to be growing 25-30% faster than the benchmark accessions. The Company has paid a onetime license fee to commercially propagate these clones for a period of 10 years and supply to farmers under its farm forestry programmes. The agreement was signed by Shri. R.S. Prashanth, Director, IFGTB and Mr. Deepak Khare, Vice President – Forestry, IP-APPM in a meeting held at IFGTB on 26 June 2015. Such a tripartite cooperation between producer-farmers end user-industries and researchers will help in taking the research results to the field and bring in additional income to farmers and increase raw material availability to the industry.
